Elias Family Facts

- The story line features 11 characters, six of whom will be in the Innoventions Dream Home at any one time.
- Disneyland Cast Members portray characters in the 5,000-plus square-foot home.
- Elias was Walt Disney's middle name.
- More than 60 character scripts are used to present the experience.
- Three different scents exist in the Dream Home: gardenia, pizza and pumpkin pie.

Furniture, Décor & Style Facts

- The style is a mix of Art Nouveau and Craftsman, created by Disney designer Tom Zofrea with inspiration from the homebuilding partner.
- The design theme celebrates the inventive thinking and optimism of both yesterday and today.
- All the furniture in the Dream Home is from the Drexel Heritage Walt Disney Collection, inspired by Walt's Art Moderne style (better known as Art Deco).
- The desk chair is a re-creation of the one Walt used when creating Mickey Mouse, Snow White and other classic animated characters.
- The sofa is similar to the one used in Walt's office and the lounge chair looks like the one from his home.
- A replica of the original Moonliner Rocket from Tomorrowland is found in the Family Room. It was the icon in front of the Flight to the Moon attraction from 1955-1966.
- The Innoventions Dream Home is the latest project touched by the magic of Disney artisans. Their craftsmanship has created beautiful one-of-a-kind pieces, along with scenery, signs and the Courtyard mural.

- The Great Room coffee table, cello cabinet and secretary were built by the Disney artisans from Scenic Fabrication, an off-property warehouse.
- Recycled material was used in the Kitchen to make the backsplash and translucent material in the cabinets. It was also used for the panels under the virtual wallpaper in the Daughter's Room.
- The Daughter's Room has an original 1940s vanity. The Art Moderne style was popular in the 30s and 40s and was originally called a Waterfall pattern.
- The floor in the Son's Room was made from giant, wooden puzzle pieces.
- The pirate ship in the Son's Room, made of solid cherry wood, was steamed to fit into place, just the way a shipwright would do on a full-scale ship.
- There are "hidden Mickeys" in one of the little picture frames, along with four in the Foyer handrail and five in the Front Yard handrails. "Hidden Mickeys" are a fun design mechanism and a tradition with Walt Disney Imagineering
- References to the old House of the Future can be found on Dad's computer desktop in the Family Room, and also in the motif surrounding tables in the Party Tent. The Monsanto House of the Future stood at the entrance to Tomorrowland from 1957-67.

Technical Facts:

- There are more than 2,500 pieces of digital media on the Dream Home network available to all devices in the structure. This includes pictures, original video, music, graphics, recorded television and movies.
- There are 73 individual, digital picture frames in the Dream Home.
- There are 26 wall-mounted frames, with photos and artwork that change depending on which family member is in the room.
- More than 2,000 photos from a digital library rotate through the frames, allowing family members to tap the power of technology to connect to the people and things they care about most.
- Guests can interact with the virtual book that holds the original manuscripts of "Alice in Wonderland," with Lewis Carroll's original notes and drawings. This technology and text are from the British Library.

- The largest screen in the Dream Home is a 100" diagonal screen in the Family Room. The smallest are 1.8" screens in the digital media players carried by select family members and showcased in the party tent.
- In the Front Yard, it takes less than a second for the "switch glass" to change from opaque to clear, and vice-versa.
- There will be 41 hands-on computer experiences (Individual Interactive Experiences or IIEs) for guests in the Dream Home.
- Home appliances throughout the Dream Home are from Siemens Home Appliances.
